Setoff Season Reminders

- ✓ **Questions:** General agency setoff or TRIP issues should be submitted to the TRIP email address. Please make sure to include your six-digit Agency ID number to ensure the most efficient handling of your request.
- ✓ Reject Corrections: When requesting a correction for a debtor due to receiving a reject notice, send the request to the TRIP email address and include your agency ID, the date the file was sent to DOR, the debtor name and either the Driver's License Number (DLN) or the last four digits of the debtor's Social Security Number (SSN).
- Reversal or Recalls: Send an email to the TRIP Email Address if you have questions regarding an action taken by DOR. Our team reviews new messages frequently and with the general email box we are better able to serve your needs than when an email is directed to a person. Please do not contact Lucy Clemens directly as she has take another position within the department.
- ✓ Security: Never send a debtor's complete SSN in an email. Email is not secure. If you are contacting the setoff coordinator about a specific debtor, you should include as much information as you have, such as name, alias names, addresses, DLN, and the last 4 digits of the SSN. With this information we should be able to find the individual. If necessary, you may be contacted by phone for the SSN.
- ✓ **TIP for successful intercepts:** Certify the debtor using the SSN. Only use the DLN if you do not have an SSN. There is a much higher success rate when an SSN is the identifier used.
- ✓ Balance Updates for Interest: Do not submit a balance update for interest any more frequently than monthly. The agency setoff system has a maximum debt limit of 200 debts and 500 transactions. We are finding that more and more debtors are reaching the maximum transaction level. Research has shown that one reason is for frequent interest posting. If you have a taxpayer who reaches the maximum, the system will no longer be able to accept a refund intercept transaction and you may lose out on a payment. The setoff coordinator will contact you if you are in danger of reaching the maximum.

Recent TRIP Outage

On Monday, October 20th the TRIP system was down. An email was sent and a system message was entered to alert of the problem. Please do not attempt to use the system until you receive a message that the system problem has been corrected.

Technical staff identified the problem as "bogus SSN's" submitted by agencies en masse. The system was not able to efficiently process all the exceptions. A bogus SSN is defined by the IRS as an invalid (or impossible) Social Security number that has not yet been assigned. The SSN is divided as follows: the area number (first three digits), group number (fourth and fifth digits), and serial number (last four digits). An SSN that begins with 000, 666 or a number greater than 772 is invalid. In addition, an SSN with 00 as the group number or 0000 as the serial number are also invalid.
