Tips to Meet Tax Filing Deadline

One month left to file tax returns on time

Tax filers have less than a month to file their taxes by the April 15 deadline. The Wisconsin Department of Revenue (DOR) is sharing some tips to help you as you prepare to file your taxes this tax season.

- 1. Use WI e-file** – Wisconsin e-file makes filing taxes easier and quicker with fill-in tax forms that help prevent errors as you prepare your Wisconsin tax return. Other benefits of e-filing include:
 - Your information is protected on our secure and confidential website
 - You'll receive a confirmation once your return is electronically submitted
 - If you owe taxes, you can use direct withdrawal. You can e-file your taxes now and choose a date to pay your taxes on or before April 15. You can also use direct deposit if you'll have a refund.
 - WI e-file is available 24/7 on our website – revenue.wi.gov

These free tax assistance sites have trained volunteers to help low-income residents, seniors, veterans, and people with disabilities prepare their tax returns.
